This past summer we traveled to a small, seaside village named Spille in southern Albania where a new Bible study has begun. There we met this sweet family of new believers who welcomed us into their home. There we sang songs and I shared the Word. Afterward Nasi, the husband, showed me the Bible he was reading, and told me that he was reading through the book of Matthew. He mentioned a passage in Chapter 13:2 where Jesus sat in a boat and taught from the water because of the multitude of people on the shore. Nasi and his wife followed us to the Adriatic where we were going to have a baptism.

A crowd began to form as I read from the Word and the baptisms were performed. Immediately after the baptisms, I came out of the water and began to evangelize the crowd that had gathered because of curiosity. Nasi never left my side as I preached the Gospel for about one half hour. When I asked them if any would like to receive Christ as their Savior, four people stepped forward. It was as we bowed our heads to pray, that I noticed that Nasi and I were indeed standing in the water.

This past week, one of the women who was there and prayed with us, met a girl from our church. She told her that she was planning her suicide the day we met her on the beach. Now she is praying and reading the Bible, and rejoicing in her life with Christ. The Gospel of Jesus Christ heals the brokenhearted, (Luke 4:18).

In Bangkok, we are in the Word of God revival, and many souls are being saved. In Bible school, the attendance is nearly perfect, as students are convinced of the priority of God's Word. Last night, during one of our many Bangkok outreaches, several Thai men got saved. Phum was led to Christ on a similar outreach three years ago. He was to translate for Sandon, but he started to witness: "You are on the path to hell. God loves you and sent us to rescue you tonight!" That man got saved, gave his cell phone number and e-mail address! Ryan and I prayed with five Thai men that same evening. They each gave e-mail addresses because they want to know God. We believe your prayers are powerful. Don't stop!

I write to you of the glimpse we get into the life in Burma watching from their borders. The Burmese girls climb over the chain-link and barbed-wire fence, and perform a tight-rope walk along a six-inch wide bridge edge. We sit in the border restaurant watching in astonishment. My heart is in my throat as I expect one of them will fall to her death in front of my eyes, while I am powerless to do anything. I asked our waitress, a Burmese lady, "Why would they risk a 40-foot drop onto concrete, which may kill them?" She told me, it is because they know that there is a chance to make some money from the foreigners on the Thai side of the border. She says that behind the false smiles lie deep fear, unrest and desperation. "Under the surface they are "a pot of boiling water"; and are ready to spill over," she explains, quoting a popular proverb of Thailand. Such is the state of unfathomable despair and deception in this land of falseness. May Christ make us His light in darkness. The poverty is a small problem compared to the desperation which drives them to do terrible things. Girls risk their lives to get into Thailand. They have heard that men will give them a bed and food in exchange for sex. Mothers sell their babies, brothers give up the location of fellow soul-winners. Men who are Christian pretend to be atheists to avoid the internal security force of the military junta controlling Burma today.

Angallay is a Burmese pastor who has four years of Bible College but cannot earn a salary. He escaped Burma into Thailand where he is illegal. His wife, who will turn

Here is our update from the city of Yekaterinburg, Russia, as we continue here by God's amazing grace. Recently, the Lord has been doing something amazing with church services that we are able to hold three times a week thanks to our GG Moscow church's loving support. Last Sunday, over 20 people gathered to have a simple service and a rap session. Still after 3.5 hours people didn't hurry home but continued to fellowship even after we had finished.

Last week, two Christian men leaders approached me and said they would like to be a part of our ministry here. Another born-again couple began to come out. These people know each other and have awaited a Body-life and grace-oriented church to appear in their city. They tell others about us, ask amazing doctrinal questions, and are astounded at the finished work answers. During the Sunday evening rap I mentioned about the 95 things God gives a person at the point of salvation. Right away, a 27-year-old-man asked me to give these truths. So, I'm going to highlight them at the rap tonight.

Almost two weeks ago, we received a notification from the Immigration Office informing that my wife Natasha, son David, and my parents have been refused citizenship of the Russian Federation. I called the Moscow Regional Immigration Office to find out the reason for refusal. I was told that the former chief of the office was caught at counterfeiting citizenship papers, got fired and is currently undergoing prosecution. Having learned this, we decided we need to take my elderly parents back to Baku and make sure they have necessary living conditions and retirement funds. We would try to refile Natasha and David's applications.

Please pray for the amazing people God is bringing to our young church here in Yekaterinburg. Pray for us to have necessary funds to return from Baku. We had hoped I could earn a living in Russia by translating and interpreting like I used to do in Baku, Azerbaijan. Unfortunately, the past 3.5 months have proven I was wrong.

May we ask you to pray for a Bible school to emerge, Body-life to grow, church registration to be obtained and

team members to be added. Thank you so very much for your participation with us on this field!

20 this winter, has just given birth to a baby boy. The people we brought to Christ last January during outreach are now his church. We give them rice and other staples, but he needs more. He is trying to translate our Bible college classes into Burmese for his men to be trained, but everyday is a struggle for them.

We have many little groups of Burmese men just like him. I am meeting with them when I can, and we provide Bible school materials, but what can we do? We cannot pastor them, nor can we feed them. We are too small and weak. We can barely pay our rent and basic costs in Bangkok. Yet, God is great and trustworthy. I hear their cries each night; as a father, it gnaws at me. We covet your prayers as we reach out to these people.
